Eligibility Requirements

Candidate must be a full or part time student with a declared accounting major or an emphasis in accounting (if a community college student), The school must be located within the Sacramento Chapter's geographical boundaries (from the southern borders of Napa, Yolo, Sacramento, Amador, Alpine & Solano Counties north to the Oregon border and east to the Nevada border, excluding the coastal counties of San Francisco, Marin, Sonoma, Mendocino, Humboldt & Del Norte Counties).

Community colleges within the Sacramento chapter sphere of influence:

Scholarships applicants to community college students must have a minimum enrollment or successfully completed Financial and Managerial accounting with a grade of "C" or better. (Winners will be asked to submit final grades if they are showing enrolled at time of application). Community college students will need to be transferring or graduating with the next eighteen months.

When scholarships are awarded to community college students – ½ is payable when they win and the balance when they successfully complete intermediate accounting with a grade of "C" or better at a four year institution within a three year period.

Four-year universities within the Sacramento chapter sphere of influence:

California State University at Sacramento.

Seniors graduating in the Spring of 2010 are not eligible as the scholarship will be for continuing students only.

CalCPA desires to award one scholarship to a qualified student at each of the eligible colleges and universities.
